PARKS & **RIVERSIDE**

Amid the city centre hustle and bustle, Worcester has an abundance of beautiful parks and peaceful gardens perfect for walking and cycling. The stunning bridge at Diglis creates an easy circular route along the banks of the Severn, or if you prefer more of a challenge, you can be in the heart of the countryside within a few minutes.

The mighty River Severn is Britain's longest river. It runs from the Welsh mountains, down to the flatlands of the Severn estuary. Along its journey it winds through Worcester city centre, with a beautiful Riverside Park, scenic views, relaxing environments and plenty of opportunities to spot wildlife.

Fort Royal Park is located on the site of the Battle of Worcester and has some of the best views across the city. On sunny weekends, pack a picnic and listen to live music from the bandstand or enjoy a spot of tennis at Cripplegate or Gheluvelt Parks.

WORCESTER **SHOPPING**

Our indoor shopping centre, Crowngate, is a treasure trove of fashion, homeware and gifts; while nearby, the bustling charter market in Angel Place hosts local traders selling food, clothes and gifts at bargain prices from Wednesday to Saturday.

The pedestrianised trio of High Street, Pump Street and The Shambles are well-stocked with wellknown brands and quirky independents as well as a range of fabulous market stalls on Saturdays.

Make sure you wander away from the High Street towards Friar Street and New Street and you'll discover independent shops catering to every need nestled alongside charming restaurants.

Don't miss the chance to pop in to Reindeer Court and The Hopmarket – both historic courtvards packed with quirky, independent shops.

DINING OUT

ARTS & LEISURE

Worcester is a sporting hub with fixtures all year round. Most famously, Worcestershire County Cricket Club play cricket at England's most beautiful sporting ground. 
